After an enforced COVID hiatus, the gradual ascent of PURPLE THREAD back to the indie-rock universe is currently underway. Having already returned to the live scene with a bang playing a sold-out Halloween show and supporting The Luka State on The Leeds leg of their European tour, the band are now set to release their third single on Monomyth Records. The new track is an intoxicating, unrelenting and fist-pumping anthem that leaves you gasping for more.
